What a mixed year we've had on The Hill.

It's been a stella year for Netball with our A Grade and D Grade teams taking out premierships and B & C grades being in the finals mix. The preparations for next year have started well. Selection trials are done and dusted, and it seems that about 40 women and girls will miss out in 2026 as our Netball program continues to promote Red Hill as a destination of choice.

Our Women's Football squad, plagued as it was with a shortage of numbers, has continued to improve its performance as our playing skills develop further.

Our Men's program has not enjoyed the same level of success with only 2 senior team wins. Our Development squad played finals and our U19 team was very competitive and as many of the boys were bottom age we are anticipating an U19 resurgence in 2026.

As promotion and relegation however is based solely on the performance of our senior men's team, the Club has been demoted back to Division 2 for 2026.

Off the field our Club's finances have rebounded to a positive ca \$50K cash positive with a turnover of nearly \$700K. The result was thanks to the continued support of our sponsors and patrons and to the hard work of our volunteers.

After 8 years at the Hill, we say a massive thank you to Jamie Mollo, who has stepped down as Senior Men's Football Coach

Since 2018, Jamie has poured his heart and soul into our club. He's not only led from the sidelines but has completely reshaped our men's football program – driving standards, building belief, and leaving a legacy that will inspire generations to come.

On and off the field, Jamie has arguably been the most successful coach in our Club's history, achieving:

- **2 Grand Finals (2018 & 2019)**
- **1 Premiership (2019)**
- **6 Finals appearances (4 wins & 2 losses, with an average winning margin of 31 points and an average losing margin of just 10 points)**
- **126 games coached at Red Hill**
- **57% win/loss record**
- **Competing in Division 1 since 2020 – highlighted by that unforgettable first match as newly promoted Division 2 Premiers, defeating reigning Div 1 Premiers Dromana**
- **2 x Coach of the Year (2019 Div 2 & 2024 Div 1)**

Beyond the numbers, Jamie has been a driving force in developing the community-focused culture that defines our club. He has been a staunch supporter of Indigenous Round and Pride Round, while his partner Marija has made an outstanding contribution to our Reconciliation Action Plan and the promotion of Indigenous Round. Jamie has also championed women's football and netball.

The Club extends its heartfelt thanks to Jamie and his family who will always hold a special place in the Red Hill story.

At this year's Presentation Night Jamie was awarded the Van Roy Award for his outstanding contribution.
